Admission policy

of International Baccalaureate Programme at "School "President"

This Regulation describes the rules and procedures for the enrollment of students to and expelling them from the International Baccalaureate Programme in School "President".

- **1. Enrollment of Year-8 students into the Pre-IB program (education in Year 9)** is made on the basis of the following criteria:
 - a. Interview in English (identification of motivation, personal characteristics of the candidate and analytical skills)
 - b. The results of the tests in mathematics and in English as well as a test of ATL skills
 - c. Transcript for the previous two years (Years 7 and 8)
 - d. Interview with student's parents
 - e. Letter of application from the student's parents
- **2.** Enrollment of Year-9 students into the IB DP (Years 10-11, or Year 1-2 correspondingly) is made on the basis of the following criteria:
 - a. Interview in English (identification of motivation, personal characteristics of the candidate and analytical skills)
 - b. The results of the tests in mathematics, Russian and English as well as a test of ATL skills
 - c. Transcript for the previous two years (Years 8 and 9)
 - d. Characteristics from the previous educational institution
 - e. Interview with student's parents
 - f. Letter of application from the student's parents
- 3. The transfer of students of the Pre-IB program (Year 9) to the IB DP (Years 10-11, or Year 1-2 correspondingly) is made on the basis of the following criteria:
 - a. The results of the final exams for Year 9
 - b. The results of training in the Pre-IB program (Year 9), including the results of the final tests
 - c. Interview with student's parents
 - d. Letter of application from the student's parents
- **4. Expelling students from Pre-IB (Year 9) and IB (Years 10-11)** is based on one of the following criteria:
 - a. Unsatisfactory academic results in Pre-IB (Year 9) or IB DP (Years 10 or 11): '2s' in at least two subjects in a trimester (Pre-IB) or semester (IB DP) or having the status of 'postponed assessment' for over a month after the beginning of the next academic period, i.e. a trimester in Pre-IB or semester in IB DP, in the absence of valid reasons (long-term illness).
 - b. Failure to meet the deadlines
 - c. Violation of Academic Honesty policy
 - d. Failing the CAS program
 - e. Misbehavior
